How Donors Can Pay Less to Give More...ask Rick

A recently introduced Montana tax credit allows donors to pay less in Montana income taxes by giving a qualified planned gift to a Montana charitable endowment. This is an incentive of 50% of the present value of a planned gift, up to a maximum of \$13,400 tax credit, per year per individual. An outright gift by an estate or other pass-thru entity is also allowed a credit of 26.7% of the value of the gift, up to a maximum of \$13,400 tax credit.

Qualifying charitable contributions are irrevocable planned gifts to any qualified endowment. Unlike annual

giving, planned gifs are generally used by individuals and families to make an irrevocable commitment of a principal asset for the future benefit of charity. At the same time, the donor may retain the use of the asset or income from the asset during his lifetime. This tax-credit encourages individuals to make substantial charitable commitments now to the future of Montana. But it is not simply for the wealthy. It is also a way for Montanans of more modest means to provide for themselves and their favorite charities. The planned gifts may be made using any of the following techniques:

- ⇒ Charitable Remainder Unitrusts
- ⇒ Charitable Remainder Annuity Trusts
- ⇒ Pooled Income Fund Trusts
- ⇒ Charitable Lead Unitrusts
- ⇒ Charitable Gift Annuities
- ⇒ Deferred Charitable Gift Annuities
- ⇒ Life Estate Agreements (gift of a residence or farm)
- ⇒ Paid up Life Insurance Policies
